FROM PASTOR CATIE

"Now the time came for Elizabeth to give birth, and she bore a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown his great mercy to her, and they rejoiced with her. On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him Zechariah after his father. But his mother said, "No; he is to be called John." They said to her, "None of your relatives has this name." Then they began motioning to his father to find out what name he wanted to give him. He asked for a writing tablet and wrote, "His name is John." And all of them were amazed. Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue freed, and he began to speak, praising God. Fear came over all their neighbors, and all these things were talked about throughout the entire hill country of Judea. All who heard them pondered them and said, "What then will this child become?" For indeed the hand of the Lord was with him."

-Luke 1:57-66

When was the last time you were truly amazed? I don't mean surprised. I mean amazed— wrapped up in wonder, absorbed in an unexpected delight. When I picture this type of amazement, I think of the children who saw the stars for the first time during my year of service in England. As they journeyed from London to the country for a school trip, most of them had never been somewhere without lights. Streetlights, store fronts, cars, and many other lights had always prevented them from looking up and seeing the stars. As they looked up, jaws wide open, there was a moment of stillness.

Lisle Gwynn Garrity captures this sense of amazement in her piece "What Wonder Turns Into." She says: In this image, I wanted to capture the moment Zechariah's voice returns to him. I decided to depict only half of Zechariah's face; this miracle is not about him, but about what happens through him. When he confirms John's name, he sheds his distrust of the angel's impossible news. His skepticism and weariness subside as he awakens to the joy in his midst. He allows himself to be amazed.


Zechariah's voice pours out of him, parting the surrounding crowd like the Red Sea, stirring each person into confusion and bewilderment. The blessing of his song spills over to his son, who is held tenderly by his mother.

Elizabeth is the only person in this scene who is not presently swept up in wonder. I believe Elizabeth has spent months allowing herself to be amazed. She was in isolation for the first five months of her pregnancy (Luke 1:24).

And so, when Zechariah's voice returns, Elizabeth's senses have not grown dull. Instead, her amazement has metabolized into something new: attunement for her child. It has transformed into love and deep trust. It has turned into joy. When we allow ourselves to be amazed, we might be surprised what that wonder can turn into. As we spend Advent preparing for the birth of Christ, we are also in a sense preparing to be amazed. The birth of Christ was an incredible and amazing gift. So, as we anticipate this amazement allow yourself to be amazed. Whether your amazement come from the story of Christ, the stars, or something else entirely, may you be amazed this season.

If you look this verse up, you will see that this is from when Jesus is saying goodbye to his disciples. He is giving them words of promise and hope. They will remember how he loved them when they love each other. The words of promise, hope, and love are for us as well. When we work together as we did during the Fish Fry, other people will see our acts of welcome, hospitality, and hopefully, love. They will know. I want to give credit to the person who wrote the devotion these ideas come from as he is a lot more eloquent than I am. This brings me to the lessons I read just last Sunday from Hebrew where we heard we need to encourage one another. "This way our faith becomes active as it did on the Friday of the Fish Fry. And the continuation of the Hebrews lesson goes on in today's devotion to "not, therefore, abandon that confidence of yours . . . For you need endurance." In these times we really need endurance to keep our faith active. I would encourage you to find a way to let the love Jesus has given you out in some way. It is a nice way to look at things: we are just passing on the love that we have first received.
