Prophetic Imagination

A reminder of how to change the world.

"Think about it, write it down, and say it out loud,

FROM THE PRESIDENT

I have just a couple thoughts as I sit down to write to you all. The first of my thoughts come from Psalm 19 and the fourteenth verse which was the focus verse for us on a daily devotional not too long ago. "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable to you."

Sometimes we think our words and intentions have to be perfect in order to get God's attention. But God's attention isn't something we need to try and get. It is a gift. God's love is a grace given to us. And God's presence is an unconditional promise for us. We have God's ear and God's love.

Something I really felt as I skied the Birkie this past Saturday. I was so stressed the Day before because I had forgotten this very important point. The day went so well I didn't need to agonize over how things would go. The other thought I have been meditating on involves growing the church. How do we grow the church? How do we get the young people to come to our church? Questions on many of our minds.

I read a devotional from a pastor on this very subject. And the answer is always the same according to her: There is no gimmick or scheme that will lure people into church, so stop trying to find one. So what should we do? Well, we have a story to tell. It is a very compelling story about God's love and the grace that makes us feel that we can be who God really wants us to be.

Another important point that this pastor had was to build relationships with people by listening to their story. So if we tell our story and learn their story, hopefully, we can discover together where God is at work in our lives. Our prayer could be for the words we need, the courage, and the opportunity to tell Jesus' story.

In other business of the church, the boards and council are busy as usual. Thankfully we are at a quiet time of the church year, if there is such a thing. As always, if you have any questions or concerns please bring these to the attention of one of the members of the church council.

FROM THE BISHOP

"What then shall we say to this? If God is for us. who is against us?" - Romans 8:31

Dear People of the Northern Great Lakes Synod, As I write this article, we are still in a flurry of executive orders and declarations that give rise to a host of emotions. While some are cheering campaign promises kept, others fear for those most impacted and question the constitutional integrity of actions and orders. My own heart feels heavy as funds have been paused for humanitarian aid. I know the work of Lutheran Social Services makes a compassionate difference in the world and frankly, US AID funds make America look good. (It was through USAID grants that the NGLS was able to help build Kisarawe Junior Theological Seminary in Tanzania.) As we consider our theme of Seeds Sowers and planting seeds of faith, the seeds that are now being sown by these actions are unclear. Within that space of planting and growth is the tension between border security and a compassionate immigration system that works, between excessive spending and effective stewardship of federal resources, between legal processes and getting things done. What then shall we sav to this?

There is much that I disagree with, and much that provokes concern. But my understanding of the example and call of Jesus to be his disciple brings me back to what I can do, what I should do, and what lies beyond my reach (although not beyond my grief and disquiet.) I can call my congressional representatives to work to restore funds, and in the meantime, I can encourage congregations to gather in their Synod Assembly offering for World Hunger. I can support local and global efforts to address issues of poverty. I can participate with the efforts of our synod to make a difference with the people who are in our reach and continue to educate around international issues even as we pray for peaceful resolutions and just action.

And I can remember, and remind you and myself, that the God we proclaim is one who promises new life from death. The Savior we serve is one who bids us to "go and do likewise," not seeking to condemn but inviting us into a deeper understanding of how it is that the least are the greatest. God is for us and working through us to be the presence of Christ. What that means for us in these days, we figure out together. I find that the words of ELW Hymn #705 speak to me with new resonance:

God of grace, and God of glory On your people pour your power. Crown your ancient church's story. Bring its bud to glorious flower. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the facing of this hour.

Lo! The hosts of evil round us

scorn the Christ, assail his ways. From the fears that long have bound us free our hearts to faith and praise. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage. for the living of these days.

Cure your children's warring madness; Bend our pride to your control; Shame our wanton, selfish gladness, rich in things and poor in soul. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, lest we miss your Kingdom's goal.

Save us from weak resignation to the evils we deplore: Let the gift of your salvation be our glory evermore. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, serving you whom we adore.

Grant us wisdom. Grant us courage.
